Terminating a conveyancing retainer

Generally when engaged by a client to undertake conveyancing services the solicitor is obliged to complete the transaction for which he or she has been retained. Circumstances can arise during the course of the transaction which may cause the solicitor to consider whether the retainer needs to be terminated. A law practice may terminate if there is “just cause” and on “reasonable notice”.
